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## **Changes in Optometry Regulations- CEs**

R066-19(8)(4) is the Nevada Administrative Code which regards the definition of in-person CEs, and minimum passing test scores for CEs which require testing. The definition of in-person has been clarified and to match with national standards the minimum passing test score is now 70% at page 3 of 7:

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## **DEA-approved CEs**

In continuation of its vote announced in the Board's October 2024 Newsletter, for 2026-2028 licenses the Board has voted that Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA)-approved CE will count as follows:

On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 enacted a new one-time, eight-hour training requirement for all Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA)-registered practitioners. So long as DEA-approved, and at the time of the licensee's submission for credit accompanied with proof that each such hour is DEA-approved, any number of such completed hours can be applied toward the licensee's CE requirement under general, OPAC, therapeutic pharmaceutical agents, or diagnostic pharmaceutical agents.

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
